

We exist to help people, with or without great wealth, give in ways that have joy and meaning for them. When you come to the Community Foundation with a dream, we offer a variety of flexible charitable solutions to make it come to life and go on forever.

Comprised of more than 350 permanent endowment funds (and growing), the Community Foundation has awarded more than \$52 million in grants to community institutions since our beginning. Each of these grants helps make our nonprofits stronger, touches the lives of many people in very real ways and brings about transformative change that makes our region an even better place to live for all.



WHO WE SERVE

We are privileged to work with individuals, families, corporations, private foundations, nonprofits and others who reside in, or are located in, much of western and southwestern Virginia. WHAT WE DO

GIVING

Our mission is to enable people who love their community to easily give back. We always want to help folks feel good about their charitable giving. Whether their passion is arts and culture, the environment or helping students reach their educational goals, they have a professional partner and steward in the Community Foundation standing ready to help put that passion into action.

It is simple and easy to establish a Fund with the Community Foundation, whether you want to create an endowment for a favorite nonprofit or provide unrestricted support to meet the needs of the community. A Fund is created with a minimum contribution of \$10,000 (\$50,000 for scholarships and \$25,000 for agency endowments). There is no cost to set up a Fund. Thereafter a Fund is assessed an annual administrative fee ranging from 1% to 1.75%. Donors may elect to start a fund with contributions of cash, publicly traded or closely held securities, real estate, personal property or by the use of planned giving vehicles such as charitable remainder trusts, charitable lead trusts, life insurance policies and bequests. Contributions of any size are also welcome to existing Funds at any time.

GRANTMAKING

The Community Foundation works tirelessly to carry out the wishes of donors and to provide expertise in local philanthropy. We constantly stay attuned to the latest developments in the nonprofit community. If donors want information on an organization, we will promptly do research and share the results of that due diligence. We also monitor the results of grants, all with the goal of ensuring that they are effective, efficient and productive.

In addition to monetary grants, the Community Foundation provides many hours of technical expertise and strategic leadership to nonprofit organizations.

TYPES OF FUNDS

Community Foundation Serving Western Virginia is comprised of many different funds dedicated to purposes our donors define. Here are the primary options:

UNRESTRICTED FUNDS provide the greatest flexibility, allowing the Community Foundation to respond to the community's pressing needs through changing time and circumstances.

FIELD-OF-INTEREST FUNDS allow donors to pinpoint support to broad areas of concern, such as education, the arts, the environment, youth services or geographic areas they choose.

DESIGNATED FUNDS ensure regular, endowed support is provided to specific charitable organizations in the donors names.

DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS allow donors to make recommendations about the distribution of grants.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS help further the education of students who are selected by volunteer committees based on criteria donors outline, whether a student is from a particular geographic area, attending a certain school or planning a career in a specific field.

MEMORIAL FUNDS ensure a special person is remembered through a Fund that reflects his or her legacy.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS are created by nonprofits as a means of building charitable dollars for the future of their mission and work.







Clay met his wife, Jennifer Beeler Gravelly in March 2012. They married in June 2013 and had their first son, Quinn, in 2016. "Although Clay was a public figure as the city's lead prosecutor, he was first and foremost a family man," Jennifer said. "He was the best husband, the best friend, the best supporter I could have ever imagined. And although he was a father for only a short time, he was the best father I could have hoped for."

Before he died, Jennifer showed him the first ultrasound pictures and video of their son, Brooks, who was born in August 2018.

The H. DISASTER RELIEF PROGRAM

The Foundation is extremely grateful to our many fund holders and donor advisors who played a significant role in our special 2020 Disaster Relief Program. Your overwhelming generosity and compassion for others provided much needed hope and critical support for the wonderful nonprofits that serve the places we call home. Because of you, your community foundation was able to mobilize quickly to award nearly \$287,000 to help sustain over 40 organizations!

DISASTER RELIEF GRANTS RECIPIENTS

ADULT CARE CENTER OF ROANOKE VALLEY: \$11,656 to provide financial support during this crisis.

ARCH ROANOKE: \$5,000 to provide shelter for those individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 while also providing a safe shelter for its current, healthy clients.

BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS OF SW VA: \$20,000 to support its Takeout Hunger Campaign.

BRADLEY FREE CLINIC: \$6,900 to provide the needed clinical support as a result of a reduced volunteer base.

CHILDREN'S TRUST OF ROANOKE VALLEY: \$10,000 to support its operations during this crisis.

Camille Maria Lownds was a native of Philadelphia and a resident of New York and Canada before coming to Roanoke. She was a fashion model, actress, producer, director and documentary filmmaker, author, world traveler and cat enthusiast. During her varied career, she appeared in numerous television shows such as "Miami Vice," "Cagney & Lacey," and in a dozen movies such as "The Godfather" and "Sweet Liberty." She also appeared in off-Broadway productions and in numerous commercials.

Camille called Roanoke home for only three years. However, this unique lady quickly developed a special fondness and passion for the area. Founding the Virginia Highlands Film Office soon after her arrival in 1999, she worked tirelessly to attract filmmakers from across the country and around the world to southwest Virginia.

Unfortunately, Camille's life was cut short in 2002 at age 63 by cancer. In the latter stages of her illness, she made arrangements through her estate plans to provide a wonderful gift which would live on in the community forever. The Camille M. 


