# ★ PRESIDENT'S LETTER ★

Each year, when it comes time to put pen to paper for my "letter" in the Annual Report, I struggle to come up with some pithy or profound pertinent statements that will intrigue and delight you, the reader. This year is different. It is different because I am simply going to tell (briefly) a story and a dream realized, so please indulge me for a trip down memory lane!

The Community Foundation became a legal reality in August, 1988. The first accounting records show that as of June 15, 1989, the Foundation's asset balance was \$40.29, zero income for that month, expenses of \$3.18, leaving assets on hand of \$37.11. Talk about "quick" books! And frighteningly real for a brand new charitable endeavor. By the end of 1989, I can report that the Foundation had grown by a sizzling factor of 7x — reaching \$258. Yes, there was light at the end of the tunnel (albeit some micro faction of one lumen!)

As the Executive Director of the Foundation and only staff member, my task was very clear. Raise assets or have the community foundation die on the vine and wither away, much as an effort to start a local community foundation had done in the late 1960s. An early newspaper editorial proclaimed "The Foundation needs to get off to a strong start." Yes, public pressure from the get-go. Interestingly though, that same editorial contained the following passage: "The Foundation can do something that many other organizations aren't set up for: it can grant wishes. If a Valley resident who loves the outdoors would like to send underprivileged children to a summer camp, the Foundation will work out the details. The resident doesn't have to spend time looking for the agency or organization capable of carrying out the plan." "Granting wishes" was the beginnings of the special sauce I needed to persevere.

Along with a wonderful and generous board of governors (a hallmark of the community foundation that continues to this day), we began to plan how we could reach \$5,000,000 in assets, which was a figure that an esteemed consultant in the field said was the necessary "critical mass." Well, that took way longer than expected, as we did not reach that level until 1996. But we did reach it, and meeting that first threshold allowed me, and the foundation, to begin dreaming of much bigger things. What would it be like to have \$20 million in charitable funds? Or \$50 million. Or, did we even dare think that someday \$100 million could be possible? A pipe-dream of sorts at that point, but one that I never let slip from my mind.

Fast forward over the past three decades, through the addition of incredible, talented and dedicated staff members, receiving innumerable acts of community generosity, and through visionary and encouraging board leadership, your community foundation — Community Foundation Serving Western Virginia — this year just blew right past that long-held dream of hitting \$100,000,000 in assets. What a joyous feeling of knowing that the foundation did "get off to a strong start," and that it has already granted over \$60 million in wishes. Celebrate with us for a moment in reaching this milestone, because it is a milestone in which you have played a very important role.

***Now, on to the next dream. \$250 million perhaps?***

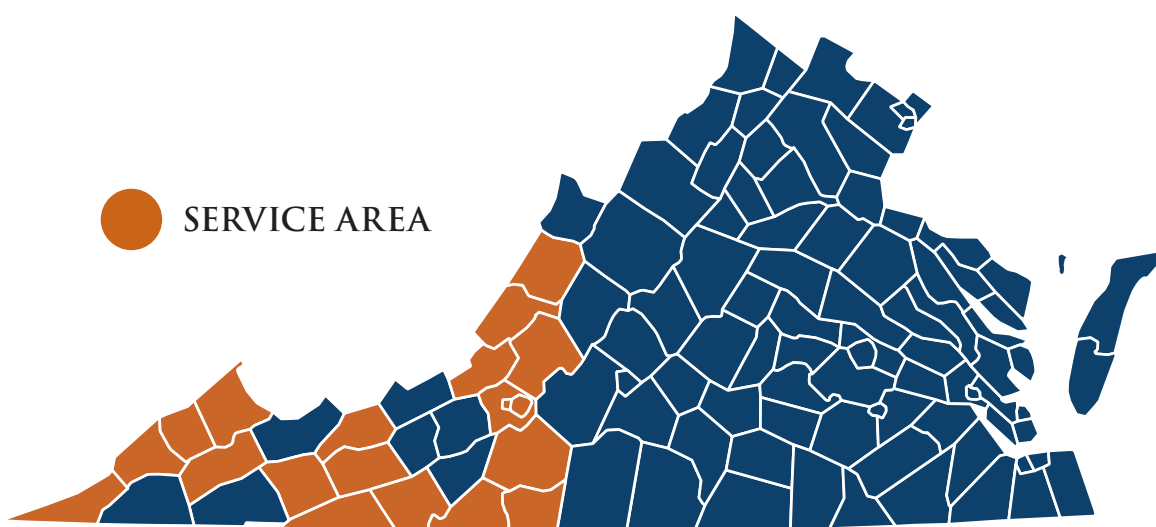

# ★ WHAT WE DO ★

## GIVING

Our mission is to enable people who love their community to easily give back. We always want to help folks feel good about their charitable giving. Whether their passion is arts and culture, the environment or helping students reach their educational goals, they have a professional partner and steward in the Community Foundation standing ready to help put that passion into action.

It is simple and easy to establish a Fund with the Community Foundation, whether you want to create an endowment for a favorite nonprofit or provide unrestricted support to meet the needs of the community. A Fund is created with a minimum contribution of \$10,000 (\$50,000 for scholarships and \$25,000 for agency endowments). There is no cost to set up a Fund. Thereafter a Fund is assessed an annual administrative fee ranging from 1% to 1.75%. Donors may elect to start a fund with contributions of cash, publicly traded or closely held securities, real estate, personal property or by the use of planned giving vehicles such as charitable remainder trusts, charitable lead trusts, life insurance policies and bequests. Contributions of any size are also welcome to existing Funds at any time.

## GRANTMAKING

The Community Foundation works tirelessly to carry out the wishes of donors and to provide expertise in local philanthropy. We constantly stay attuned to the latest developments in the nonprofit community. If donors want information on an organization, we will promptly do research and share the results of that due diligence. We also monitor the results of grants, all with the goal of ensuring that they are effective, efficient and productive.

In addition to monetary grants, the Community Foundation provides many hours of technical expertise and strategic leadership to nonprofit organizations.

## TYPES OF FUNDS

Community Foundation Serving Western Virginia is comprised of many different funds dedicated to purposes our donors define. Here are the primary options:

**UNRESTRICTED FUNDS** provide the greatest flexibility, allowing the Community Foundation to respond to the community's pressing needs through changing time and circumstances.

**FIELD-OF-INTEREST FUNDS** allow donors to pinpoint support to broad areas of concern, such as education, the arts, the environment, youth services or geographic areas they choose.

**DESIGNATED FUNDS** ensure regular, endowed support is provided to specific charitable organizations in the donors names.

**DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS** allow donors to make recommendations about the distribution of grants.

**SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS** help further the education of students who are selected by volunteer committees based on criteria donors outline, whether a student is from a particular geographic area, attending a certain school or planning a career in a specific field.

**MEMORIAL FUNDS** ensure a special person is remembered through a Fund that reflects his or her legacy.

**AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS** are created by nonprofits as a means of building charitable dollars for the future of their mission and work.

Established by the late Lewis Parsley, this fund places a premium on the preservation of dignity, hope and personal independence for the elderly and needy. The fund addresses three specific community concerns: to help the elderly and needy afford prescription medications; to fight substance abuse; and to help elderly and needy obtain home health services when they cannot manage alone.

Established by the B. Wilson Porterfield, Jr. Foundation, this fund addresses the broad needs of children in the Valley from prenatal care until their sixth birthday.

## Romero Family Fund\*

Established by Betty LaPrade Romero, this fund provides medical assistance to the elderly and disabled population in Henry and Franklin Counties and the City of Martinsville.

## Ann and Bill Scheer Fund

Established by the late Ann and Bill Scheer, this fund provides broad support for the elderly citizens of the Roanoke Valley.

## School Violence Assistance Fund

Established by numerous donors to assist the victims and families of victims of the April 16, 2007 tragedy at Virginia Tech. Unused funds will be available to address other school violence issues.

## Dr. Charles L. Shedd Endowment Fund

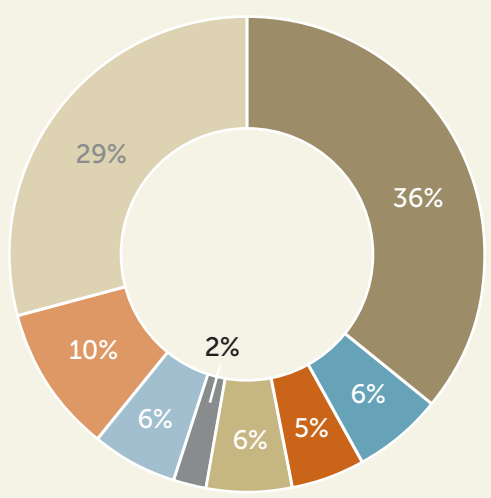

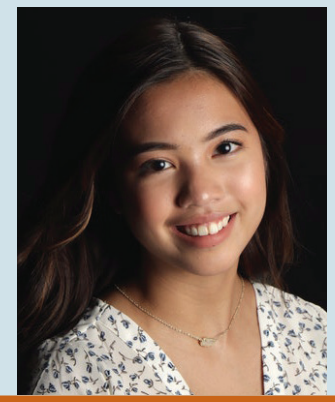

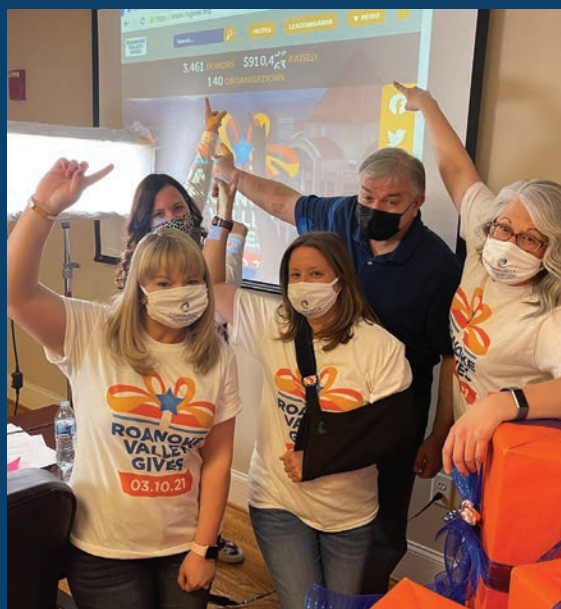

## A REMARKABLE PERSON AND DEDICATED TEACHER

### ★ THE DONNA FEW MEMORIAL FUND ★



Every once in a while you meet a remarkable person, and Mrs. Few was that person. "Mrs. Few taught me about life, how we should never take it for granted." Donna Epling Few was an 8th grade Algebra teacher at the former Drewry Mason Middle School in Henry County Public Schools. These sentiments were shared by two of her former students at the Henry County Schools Excellence Awards Banquet several years ago. Donna taught Algebra from 1993 to May 2003 when she was diagnosed with a brain tumor and could no longer teach. She passed away in December 2003 at 45 years old.

Donna was born in Ridgeway and graduated from Drewry Mason High School and from Patrick Henry Community College. She married Tim Few in 1978. The couple had three children, Jaime in 1983, Stacy in 1984 and Cameron in 1988 who died at birth. Once her girls were school age, she decided to pursue her passion to teach by attending Averett University and receiving her Bachelor of Education degree.

During her tenure in the school system, she touched the lives of many, many students. She had a special connection with the kids. She was one who taught multiple ways so each student could learn accordingly and also tutored after school in order to help students succeed. Another student shared this, "She was passionate about her role as an educator. Teaching came naturally to her and it showed through her interactions with her students."

Outside of love for teaching, Donna's pride and joy were her girls. Both Jaime and Stacy were involved in multiple extracurricular activities and she always put their needs ahead of her own. Her daughter Stacy Few Peters shared that her mother had a quick wit and was very funny. Another student of hers remarked, "She taught me that each day should be lived with a smile and a bit of humor."

Although Donna wasn't able to teach after her diagnosis, students visited her constantly and showed an outpouring of support at her funeral. Because of the impact she made in the school system, her family decided to set up a fund that would provide an annual scholarship to a student at Magna Vista High School with the highest GPA in Math. Since that time, 14 scholarships have been awarded.

Recently, Donna's family decided to change and expand the reach of the fund originally established. They worked with Community Foundation Serving Western Virginia to set up the Donna Few Memorial Fund. The fund will support and further enhance math programs in the middle and high schools within Henry County Public Schools. Her family said, "This is the perfect way to continue to keep Donna's memory alive in this community and to continue her legacy of educating students and helping them succeed. She would be so happy about this because she was put on this Earth to teach."

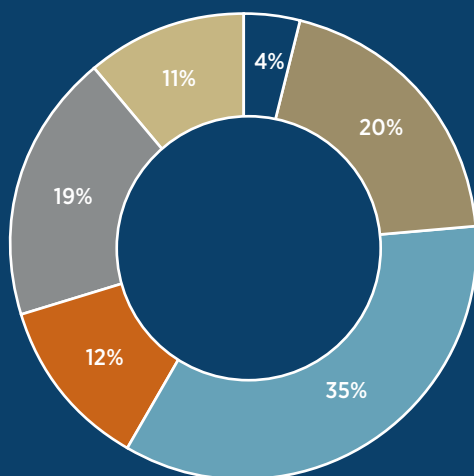

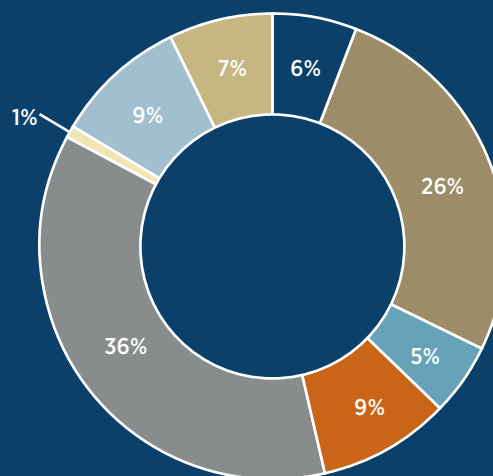
